



POINT 8 PARENTING PROGRAM – COOKIE USE

In order to access and use our website, you must have accepted receiving cookies.

1. What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or other web accessing devices by our website. These cookies allow us to distinguish you from other users of our website, which helps us provide you with an enhanced user experience when you browse our website and also allows us to improve our website.

2. What are the different types of cookies you use and why do you use them?

We use cookies on this website to do the following:

- a. To ensure the Website delivers a consistent look across different browsers and devices
- b. To remember your log-in details if you are a registered user
- c. To ensure you are secure when logged in
- d. To allow complex sections of our website to function properly
- e. To track anonymized aggregate statistics about visits to the our website in order to help us improve our website's performance
- f. To direct you to the relevant sections on our website

Also, in doing this, we may install cookies that collect the domain name of the user, the internet service provider, the operating system, and the date and time of access.

Below, we have provided a table explaining the basic types of cookies we use and their purpose or function.

Type of Cookie	Function
First Party Cookies	These cookies are set by the website being visited by the user (which is the website displayed in the URL window)
Session Cookies	These cookies expire at the end of a browser session (starting with the time when a user opens the browser window and then finishing when the user exists the browser)
Persistent Cookies	These cookies "persist" in the device after the end of a browser session and can allow the preferences or actions of the user to be remembered when the site is revisited



Our third-party partners, the hosting service provider, and/or the web-analytical service partner may collect data about your use of our website because of these anonymized internet tags or cookies, and may compose reports regarding the website's activity for us and may provide further services which are related to the use of the website and the internet. They may provide such information to other parties if there is a legal requirement that they do so or if they hire other parties to process information on their behalf.

3. Using your browser settings to control and delete cookies

Most web browsers allow control of most cookies through the browser settings. You can set your browser to notify you when you receive a cookie. This will allow you to determine if you want to accept it or not. However, if you do not accept, you may not be able to use all functionality of your browser software.
